Summary

Caedelyn Park is a well used and popular park located in Rhiwbina. It contains high quality pitches for football, rugby, and cricket complete with pavilion and car park. There's plenty of space for informal recreation and an equipped playground is also provided.

Features of Interest

Recreation

Football, rugby and cricket pitches are all available at this Park. There's plenty of space for informal recreation and a children's playground is also provided.

Nature

Although the park is mainly set out for pitches, there are many trees around the edge of the grassed area and a brook runs along one boundary. Look out for local birds and wildlife that takes advantage of this wide open space.

Facilities

A large pavilion with changing rooms is provided. There is a large car park next to the pavilion.

Access Within

There are some generally flat, hard surfaced paths that run across the Park.

Getting There

By foot - Access is from Caedelyn Road and Northern Avenue. A footpath also enters the park from the north, via a footbridge over the railway line.

By bus - A number of bus routes run along Northern Avenue. Details of bus routes can be found at www.cardiffbus.com

By train - Rhiwbina Railway Station is next to the Park with access gained by the footbridge over the tracks. Also, Whitchurch Railway Station is a 300m walk from the Park. Details of train services can be found at www.networkrail.com

By car - There is a large car park at the Park. Access for vehicles can be gained from the entrance on Northern Avenue.

Nearby

The Rhiwbina local centre is close to the northern corner of the park. This area also includes the Rhiwbina Garden Village Conservation Area, a great example of the 'garden village' design.

Other open spaces not too far away include:

Forest Farm

This large area situated in the Taff Gorge is full of interest. It was designated a Country Park in 1992 due to its role for tourism and recreation.

Glamorgan Canal Local Nature Reserve

This is an artificial wetland and woodland local nature reserve.

Hailey Park

The well used Taff Trail passes through the park. It adds to the already excellent recreational facilities on offer.

What You Said

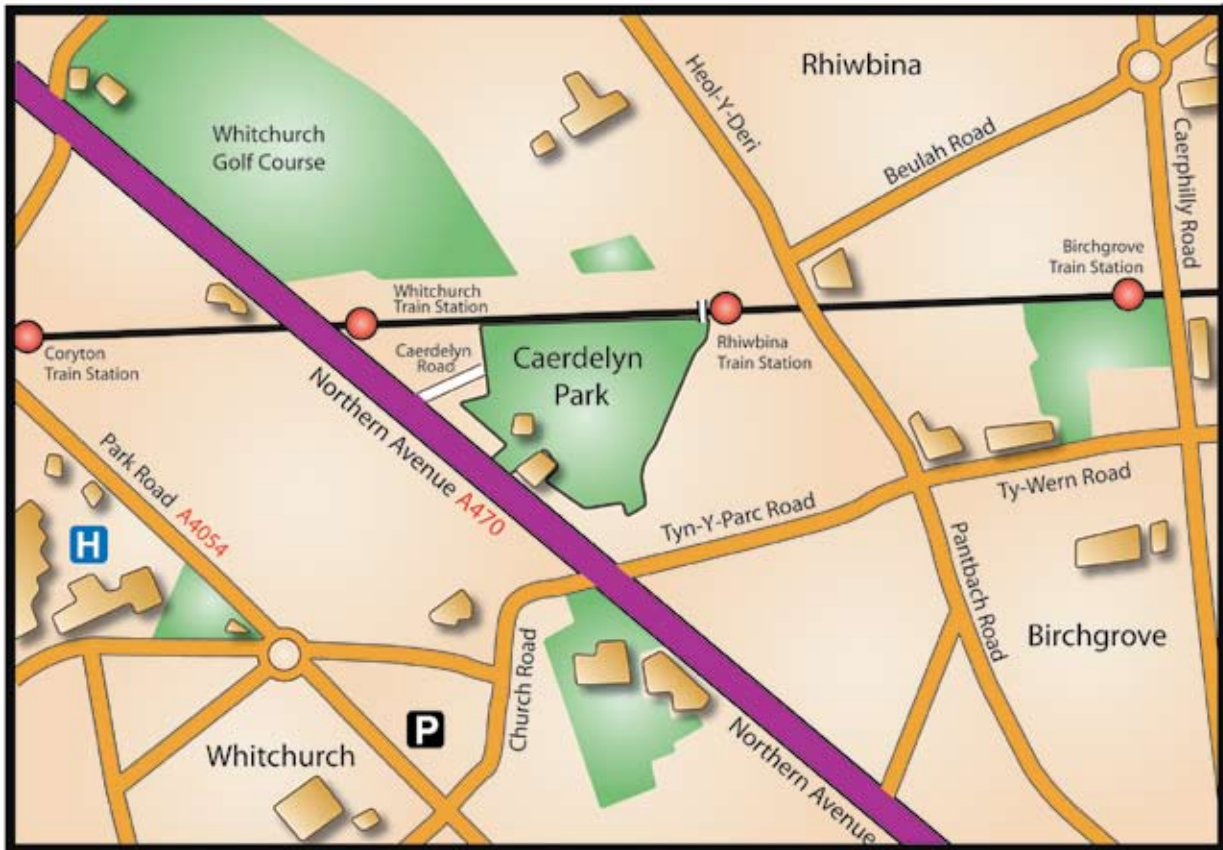
